This Privacy Policy ("Policy") explains how 4betterdevices GmbH ("we", "us", "our") collects and handles your personal data when you browse and interact with this website in accordance with article 13 of the General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR").

"Personal data" means any information that can be used to identify a specific person.

Your privacy is very important to us and the GDPR allows us to protect your personal information. Personal data collected through Evidence Website will be processed solely and exclusively for the purposes described in this Policy and will not be used for any other purpose.

We do not process special categories of personal data (such as data concerning health), nor data relating to criminal convictions and offences.

We will process your personal data for the following **purposes**:

1) Provision of the website

After booking a meeting with us, should you decide to test our product, specific terms will apply. 4) Detecting, identifying and preventing fraud or abuse on the Website

We need to process browsing data for the purpose of detecting, identifying and preventing fraud or abuse on the Website.	Browsing data such as location (country), type of device, necessary technical information for connection and navigation (domain name, Uniform Resource Identifier, etc.)	Our legitimate interest in preventing the risk of fraud and abuse on our website - Article 6(1)(f) GDPR	Your data is necessary for allowing us to detect and prevent fraud and abuse. In any case, you may oppose to the processing at any time by contacting us.

Do we disclose your data to anyone?

In order to provide our service to you, we may have to disclose your personal data to third parties, public and/or private by virtue of a legal obligation.

We also rely on third party service providers, acting as Data Processors under Article 28 GDPR, for the provision of some of the features on our website and we may share some of your personal data with them under appropriate confidentiality and security obligations and in accordance with our instructions and with this Policy. For instance, in order to allow you to book a demo with us via our website, we use Calendly, an online scheduling tool. For more information about the service, please see Calendly's Privacy Notice.

Do we transfer your data outside the EU/EEA?

Your personal data will be processed within the European Union and the European Economic Area. Should it be necessary for your personal data to be transferred to third countries outside the EU/EEA, such data transfers will take place only to third countries with an Adequacy Decision in place approved by the European Commission or, in case of no Adequacy Decision, based on Standard Contractual Clauses provided by the European Commission and additional security measures to ensure data security.

How long do we retain your personal data?

We will retain your personal data only as long as necessary to fulfill the purposes for which we collected it, including purposes related to fulfilling legal, tax or accounting obligations.

A longer retention period may be required in the event of a legal complaint or in the event of disputes related to our existing contractual relationships.

To determine the retention period of personal data, we take into account:

- the purposes for which we process the personal data, and whether we can achieve those purposes by other means;
- the amount, nature and sensitivity of the data processed;
- the potential risk of harm to individuals derived from unauthorized use or disclosure.

If personal data is no longer necessary for the purposes or legitimate interests pursued by us, and no other legal basis applies, we will delete your data.

How do we support you in exercising your rights?

We inform you that you have the right to:

- Ask us whether or not your personal data is being processed, and if so, request access or ask for copies of your personal data. You can also ask us for further information related to this Policy (Right of Access);
- Ask us to rectify information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete (Right to rectification);
- Ask us to erase your personal data in certain circumstances (Right to erasure or 'right to be forgotten');
- Object, under certain circumstances, to the processing of personal data, for reasons relating to your specific situations (Right to object);
- Not be subjected to automated decision-making, including profiling (Rights related to automated individual decision-making, including profiling);
- Receive personal data in a standardized format in case you wish to transfer them to another data controller (Right to data portability);
- Lodge a complaint at any time with the Data Protection Authority, in case of violation of data protection rights (Right to lodge a complaint with a Supervisory Authority);
- Ask us to restrict the processing of your information in certain circumstances (Right to restrict the processing);
- In the event of rectification, erasure, or restriction of the processing of your personal data, we are committed to notifying such changes to all recipients to whom the data has been disclosed, unless this proves impossible or involves disproportionate effort;
- Withdraw your consent at any moment.

The exercise of rights is not subject to any formal constraints and is free of charge.
