Introduction

Welcome to the Doctorsa Privacy Policy.

This Privacy Notice ("Notice") sets out the terms under which we handle your personal data while you use Doctorsa in accordance with article 13 of the General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR"). Your privacy is very important to us and the GDPR allows us to protect your personal information.

"Personal data" is any information relating to an identifiable living individual. This encompasses information that directly identifies a person (like their name or address) as well as indirect identifiers (random IDs) that, when combined with other pieces of information, could reasonably be used to pinpoint a specific person.

Personal data collected through Doctorsa will be processed solely and exclusively for the purposes described in this document and will not be used for any other purpose.

Device permissions for Personal Data access

Depending on the Doctor's (hereinafter also simply "User") specific device, the Doctorsa platform (hereinafter also simply "Application") may request certain permissions that allow it to access the User's device Data as described below.

By default, these permissions must be granted by the User before the respective information can be accessed. Once the permission has been given, it can be revoked by the User at any time. In order to revoke these permissions, Users may refer to the device settings or contact the Owner for support at the contact details provided in the present document. The exact procedure for controlling app permissions may be dependent on the User's device and software.

Please note that the revoking of such permissions might impact the proper functioning of this Application.

If User grants any of the permissions listed below, the respective Personal Data may be processed (i.e accessed to, modified or removed) by this Application.

Camera permission, without saving or recording Used for accessing the camera or capturing images and video from the device. This Application does not save or record the camera output.

Microphone permission, without recording Allows accessing and recording microphone audio from the User's device. The recording feature is not used on this Application.

Precise location permission (non-continuous) Used for accessing the User's precise device location. This Application may collect, use, and share User location Data in order to provide location-based services. The geographic location of the User is determined in a manner that isn't continuous. This means that it is impossible for this Application to derive the exact position of the User on a continuous basis.

Do we disclose your data to anyone?

We will not disclose personal data to third parties, unless such disclosure is necessary to carry out certain processing activities.

This might be the case where:

- We need to rely on certain service providers (e.g.: IT service providers, consultants) and in such cases, we ensure that our suppliers, acting as Data Processors under Article 28 GDPR, will only process your personal data under appropriate confidentiality and security obligations and in accordance with our instructions and with this Notice;
- When required by law or when we have a legitimate interest to do so (to comply with requests from judicial authorities or other legal obligations; to bring or defend a claim or lawsuit; as part of a reorganization, merger, or the transfer of our assets to another company).

Do we transfer your data outside the EU/EEA?

Your personal data will be processed within the European Union and the European Economic Area. Should it be necessary for your personal data to be transferred to third countries outside the EU/EEA, such data transfers will take place only to third countries with an Adequacy Decision in place approved by the European Commission or, in case of no Adequacy Decision, based on Standard Contractual Clauses provided by the European Commission and additional security measures to ensure data security.

How long do we retain your personal data?

We will retain your personal data only as long as necessary to fulfill the purposes for which we collected it, including purposes related to fulfilling legal, tax or accounting obligations.

A longer retention period may be required in the event of a legal complaint or in the event of disputes related to our existing contractual relationships.

To determine the retention period of personal data, we take into account:

- the purposes for which we process the personal data, and whether we can achieve those purposes by other means;
- the amount, nature and sensitivity of the data processed;
- the potential risk of harm to individuals derived from unauthorized use or disclosure.

If personal data is no longer necessary for the purposes or legitimate interests pursued by us, and no other legal basis applies, we will delete your data.

How do we support you in exercising your rights?

We inform you that you have the right to:

- Ask us whether or not your personal data is being processed, and if so, request access or ask for copies of your personal data. You can also ask us for further information related to this Policy (Right of Access);
- Ask us to rectify information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete (Right to rectification);
- Ask us to erase your personal data in certain circumstances (Right to erasure or 'right to be forgotten');
- Object, under certain circumstances, to the processing of personal data, for reasons relating to your specific situations (Right to object);
- Not be subjected to automated decision-making, including profiling (Rights related to automated individual decision-making, including profiling);
- Receive personal data in a standardized format in case you wish to transfer them to another data controller (Right to data portability);
- Lodge a complaint at any time with the Data Protection Authority, in case of violation of data protection rights (Right to lodge a complaint with a Supervisory Authority);
- Ask us to restrict the processing of your information in certain circumstances (Right to restrict the processing);
- In the event of rectification, erasure, or restriction of the processing of your personal data, we are committed to notifying such changes to all recipients to whom the data has been disclosed, unless this proves impossible or involves disproportionate effort;
- Withdraw your consent at any moment.

The exercise of rights is not subject to any formal constraints and is free of charge.
